## Monday 30th March

This week, school is ONLY open for parents and carers of critical key worker and vulnerable children. For children to attend school, places have to be pre-arranged with the school and requests for places will be confirmed via email. In light of the increasing risks, please do not turn up to school on any day unless you have had confirmation of a place. We are operating a scant skeleton staff and for the circumstances around social distancing, we will not accept any child who is not on the register.

On Friday, the Government re issued their guidance and again strongly reiterated the message that, 'the fewer children making the journey to school, and the fewer children in educational settings, the lower the risk that the virus can spread and infect vulnerable individuals in wider society'. This naturally includes protecting my staff, their families and my own. As this situation gets worse, please only ask for a school place if, because of your critical work that there is no other choice. Parents working from home should keep their children at home. We are all having to adjust in this new world of working and it is hard on both parents and the children. My own son is finding the lack of routine and not seeing any of his friends and family really hard but, we are trying our best to stay positive. I hope you all will too.

Finally, on Thursday, the local authority issued us instructions for providing food hampers to low income families. Hampers will be available again by the end of this week and then the local authority hopes to issue food vouchers there after. We will let you know.
