School Start Times

I want to remind you all again that we will be changing the start of the school day from the 3rd January.

There are signs all around school with this information on. It will be as follows:

- The gates will open at 8.35am.

- The gates will be locked at 8.50am.
- Late arrivals after 8.50am will be marked as late.

Chartwells Hot Meal Ordering with ParentPav

You should now be in receipt of a paper copy of your activation code, to be able to log-in to ParentPay, to submit the hot meal options your child is having. Please note even if your child is bringing in a packed lunch from home this also needs to be logged too, as every child has to be accounted for. Please remember that this is a new system being introduced by West Sussex County Council and this is not the school's decision and we are unable to opt out.

Currently 54% of parents have activated their accounts which equate to 112 activated and 94 not activated. We have had some great feedback in how easy the new system is to use - thank you! Please do this as soon as you can because if you don't, you may have problems in the future.

Abusive Comments Made on Social Media

At Bartons, we believe it's important for our pupils to learn how to treat others with respect, including when they're online. Parents have an important role to play in modelling this for their children.

We ask parents to kindly refrain from using inappropriate language, or from speaking about staff, parents and pupils in a way that is rude, offensive, intimidating or threatening.
