This week, we have been able to open

the school to more children in a phased return for some Year R, 1 and 6 children. Much planning and hard work has been done to prepare the environment for the children's safe return and we are pleased with how we have adapted the school building. We have also had to expand our provision for key worker and vulnerable children as the the Government has eased lockdown restrictions. This has meant that we are approaching capacity and for some days, this provision is already full. Due to demand, we are having to offer places to families where all adults in the household are returning to their place of work and therefore there will be no one at home/ working from home to look after the child/ren. We will be reviewing this week to week.

In order to staff the additional key worker bubbles, as well as accommodate the Year R, 1 and 6 children, the teachers are taking on additional responsibilities. This means that the format for online working will be different. Years R, 1 and 6 will have work set on a Wednesday and their teachers will review it the following on Wednesdays. This is for children who are not attending school and for those who are attending part-time. Thank you for your on-going support.
