We are **STILL** collecting essential items to support the Ukrainian refugees. The Essential Items are:

- Warm adult and children's socks
- Thermal clothing for adults and children (scarves, hats, gloves, vests, tights, long johns)
- First-Aid products (anti-septic wipes, Savlon type cream, disinfectant, bandages, micro-pore tape, dressings, tissues)
- Soap and wash cloths
- Long expiration date foods – **in date** (powdered milk, pasta, tins of food, long-life UHT milk.)

This week, we have been experiencing more staff absence as a result of the coronavirus. Over the last few months, the guidelines have changed as restrictions have eased. Today, the guidance changes again. Whilst, it seems, we have to learn to live with the virus, we still consider the safety of the whole school community very important. **Our expectation** is that if a pupil or staff member tests positive for Covid-19, then they need to stay at home and avoid contact with others for at least 5 days. As for all illnesses, children and staff should only return to school, once they are well. An LFT device is useful to confirm a positive case and please continue to tell us if your child has the virus. We still have to report the number of cases to the DfE and it supports the tracking of any significant outbreaks in schools. The whole team are pulling together but please be patient because covering staff is proving to be very difficult at the moment. Stay safe and please be supportive of our procedures.
