Coronavirus Update

I wanted to let you know that we are continuing to follow closely the advice given by Public Health England and the DFE regarding the outbreak of the coronavirus. On their advice, the school remains open as usual. This week, we put in place a specific hand washing routine for the children to ensure good hygiene and to limit the spread of any germs. The children are told when to wash their hands and they do this with soap. Let me reassure you that the soap at school is not harmful to skin and the children are encouraged to dry their hands increased frequency properly. If the of handwashing causes mild irritation, then families could give the children some mild emollient cream to relieve this. I think that we would all agree that the advice that we have been given is sensible and necessary given the circumstances. We cannot predict how far the coronavirus will spread and what the Government will do next but, as a school, we have discussed what would happen if we are instructed to close. If this happens then we will provide work for the children to do at home via our school website and online learning platforms i.e. My Maths. So far, the Local Authority have not asked us to cancel domestic trips and so it is business as usual. I will, of course, keep you updated on the situation.
