Improvements also need to be made for children arriving late for school. In January, the registers will close at 9.05am and any late arrivals after that will be recorded as an unauthorised absence. The website has information about attendance and fixed penalty notices that parents should be aware of. Absence from school and being late has an impact on how your child learns and their social skills so please avoid family trips and holidays and routine medical and dental appointments. Thank you.
