The values and skills will underpin the curriculum and ensure that whilst we are teaching the academic side, we are also ensuring that the education of the 'whole child' is developed. The core Learning Values are: Independence, Respect, Communication, Happiness, Responsibility and Creativity. One value will be focused on each half term and will have a set of skills matched to them. These will be displayed around the school and the teachers will plan work around these .The Learning Value that we have been looking at this term so far, is Independence. The skills matched to this value are: being confident, self-motivated, self-control. self-determination organised, and resilience. Opportunities to develop these skills further will be enhanced by having dedicated 'off timetable' skills days where these can be explored.
