School Uniform and Footwear

This week I have spent time in every class observing how the children learn and how the teachers teach. It has been a great experience and given me the chance to talk to the children more closely. One thing that I have noticed, though, is that some children are not wearing the correct uniform and are not wearing appropriate footwear. It is important that children look smart and are ready to learn and that they have sensible school shoes that are not trainers or casual everyday shoes. Casual shorts, black denim trousers, and brightly coloured shoes should not be worn to school. Please ensure that after halfterm, the children wear the correct uniform. This includes a Bartons sweatshirt or cardigan, yellow t-shirt, charcoal grey or black trousers or shorts or skirt/pinafore dress and black sensible school shoes that are not fashion boots or trainers.

In the near future, we plan to change the uniform slightly to make it easier for parents and to incorporate the new school logo. This will be phased in over time and we hope to find a local stockist to hold the uniform for us, making it easier for you to order. We would like to phase out the yellow t-shirt, having listened to parents, in favour of white generic polo shirts that will not fade over time and can be bought from anywhere.
