
Walk Once a Week (WoW)



We will soon launch a walk to school initiative called Walk Once a Week (WoW) in association with The Living Streets charity. This is an incentive scheme for children to walk at least once a week to school.

Pupils will record daily how they come to school and those who walk once per week for a month are rewarded with a themed badge. Walking to school will include cycling and scootering to school. If they walk all the way from home, naturally this will count. Children will also be encouraged to and rewarded if they park and stride which means that they are driven to a certain point away from the school and then walk in the rest of the way. Parking beyond the surrounding streets e.g. Lethaby Road, Mackintosh Drive and Kelmscott Way will count as 'Park and Stride'. This is a national scheme and is promoted by the mascot Strider who may visit us on launch day. There will be a monthly trophy awarded to the class who have the most children 'walking at least once a week' to school. This is a popular scheme that over 80 schools in West Sussex are already involved with. It is about taking positive steps towards a healthy lifestyle because research has shown that a generation ago, 70% of children walked to school but now it is less than half. It is not easy for everyone to do but making an effort to do it at least once a week will make a difference.
