## School Communication

Please can I remind parents that all school communication is now through ParentPay and we switched over on the 31st May this year. ParentMail is not used anymore and so isn't monitored by any school staff. Please do not use it.

School absence can be reported either on the dedicated section in 'Communication' in ParentPay or you can leave a telephone message on the school answering machine facility. Messages should be received by 9am. If we do not hear from you, then we will contact you and it may go down as an unauthorised absence. Accrued unauthorised absence can trigger an FPN fine. Parents/carers need to send a message for every day of the absence.
