Ofsted Report

I hope that you have been able to read the Ofsted report that we sent out on Monday. We were very pleased that, over the two days, the inspector identified all the strengths of our school and listened to all the views of the school community. These positive conversations supported the evidence we submitted. She praised the learning attitudes of the children, the excellent behaviour, the strengths of teaching and learning especially in the core subjects, our curriculum, the provision for SEND and the personal development and opportunities for the children. She captured the spirit and ethos of Team Bartons really well. The areas for improvement, that she identified, are fair, in that our assessment processes for the foundation subjects are still fairly new and so, are not, yet, fully in place in some subjects. This is something that we have been working on and so, we are very aware of what still needs to be done.

Naturally, all of the work that we do is a team effort and I am very lucky to work with such hardworking and talented people, and wonderful children. Thank you to all of the staff and Governors who work tirelessly to make our school the best it can be. I am very proud of our school - Well done Team Bartons!

Hazel and Ash class explored common pop up scams that often appear in games, whilst Lime and Cedar class learnt more about the term phishing and how to protect themselves from scam (phishing) emails. The children showed a good level of maturity around these issues and were able to clearly discuss the ways they can keep themselves safe when they are online.
