Today, parents/carers of children from Year R to 5 will receive the annual consent form for the flu vaccine given in schools. The children's flu vaccine is offered as a yearly nasal spray to young children to help protect them against flu. Flu can be a very unpleasant for children, with potentially illness serious bronchitis and pneumonia. complications, including Please read the information and return the form in the next 7 days to ensure that your child/ren will receive this important vaccine. The nasal spray is completely painless and administered by nurses very guickly.
