New Uniform

As you know we are changing over to our new uniform which includes the new school logo and a change from the yellow polo shirt to a white one. We have attached the price list of the uniform from the new stockist JW Sports. Parents should be aware that prices are in line with the increases that were due to come in with the old stockist SchoolKit and so there is no difference in the prices. The items were also carefully chosen for their quality. As I have previously explained, the new logo and uniform is part of the re-branding of the school as we become an all-through primary school. The new uniform does look great! JW Sports are steadily increasing their stocks and so uniform will be ready to order in the coming weeks. I want to make it clear that the white polo's are being introduced to make it easier for parents therefore you can purchase one with the logo or not. The jumpers and cardigans with the new logo will be compulsory but as I have said, you can change to those when you need to. I have never set a date of changeover but it is an aspiration that over time, as the children grow, all of the children will be wearing the new uniform. Trousers, skirts and the blue or yellow summer dresses remain generic type and can be purchased from any shop. From September, each child will need to have the school P.E t-shirt in their house colours for P.E. JW Sports offer other parts of uniform i.e. a school coat, P.E wear and book bags but these are optional. I hope that that explains the misconceptions that have come to my notice today and must urge you to ask us directly if you have any questions rather than becoming anxious about incorrect information.
